❖ INTRODUCTION:

- Use of ICT tools, blended learning, and digital platforms.
- Assessment for learning through formative feedback, peer assessment, and reflective practices.

➤ Session-4, Faculty Collaboration, Team Teaching Models and Role of Faculty in Implementing NEP reforms:

The final session highlighted the importance of collaboration among faculty members in multidisciplinary settings. Key points included:

- Models of team teaching and co-teaching across departments.
- Interdisciplinary course planning and shared assessment responsibilities.
- Faculty roles as curriculum designers, mentors, facilitators, and change agents.
- Leadership responsibilities in institutional transformation aligned with NEP reforms.


